

Jake Fey on Monday, December 2nd at Tacoma Community College in the Student Center Cafeteria (building 11) from 6:00-8:00 pm for an important conversation about income inequality, the shrinking middle class and what we can do about it in Washington state.

Income and wealth inequality between those at the top and the rest of us is at a record high. We got here because of the flawed theory that a high concentration of wealth at the top would trickle down and create greater prosperity and a strong economy for all of us. It hasn't. Instead, it has created a polarized country in which a small group of people are doing exceptionally well and far too many are simply struggling to get by.

It's time for a new approach. We need to

grow a stronger economy from the middle out, not the top down. We need to invest in a strong middle class that can drive demand for products and services – because what businesses need more than anything else is customers. Come learn about and discuss strategies for building an economy that will work for all Washingtonians.

November 25, 2013. AAUW was one of 29 sponsors for this exciting event. Tacoma Branch President Diane Palmquist, Connie Dunkelberger, Donna Woolverton and Linda Isenson attended this gathering of 250 people from Seattle and the surrounding areas. New members Rep. Laurie Jinkins and City Council member Lauren Walker attended in their official capacities. Tacoma was well represented by other dignitaries including Mayor Marilyn Strickland, Senator Jeannie Darneille and City Council member Robert Thoms. The Washington Work Coalition in concert with the Economic Opportunity Institute and Moms Rising (momsrising.org) is presenting this forum around the country to highlight and motivate passage of legislation to help women including the Equal Pay Act, Immigration Reform, instituting paid Sick and Family leave and ENDA, a bill to end discrimination against gays, lesbians and LGBTQ people. AAUW has championed these and continues to be a voice in the other Washington and around the country to get this done!
