Elections of officers for **2015-2016** will be held at the **Branch Meeting, March 21, 2015**. There are 5 positions up for election. All of them are 2 year terms and each offers an opportunity for you to join the branch leadership. THINK ABOUT IT. The Governance Committee—Dorothy McBride, Connie Dunkelberger, and Marilee Titus—serves as the nominating committee for the branch. If someone asks you to participate, be attentive and helpful! If you are interested in doing more, contact us.

#### **PRESIDENT**

This office represents the branch to the outside world and has the power to appoint standing committee chairs and special committees and task forces. The President(s) preside at meetings of both the branch and the Board of Directors. Two years ago, two new members of the branch stepped up and volunteered to share the Presidency of the branch and they've done a terrific job. Ask either **Diane or Dana** about how they divided up their duties and their experiences and recommendations.

#### **PROGRAM VICE PRESIDENT**

This is a job that definitely can be shared by two or more. The Program VP (s) are responsible for planning branch monthly programs from September to May. If several wanted to form a "program team", each member could plan just one or two meetings. The Program VP is a two year term and a member of the board.

### TREASURER/FINANCE OFFICER

As a branch, we are fortunate to have financial resources that allow us to conduct our business and promote the AAUW branch mission. The Finance Officer leads the way by maintaining the branch accounts, proposing the annual budget, and disbursing funds as directed by the branch and the board. This job is at the heart of branch operations.

### **GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE: 2 MEMBERS**

The Governance and Development Committee is composed of 3 members elected by the branch. The committee keeps the bylaws and procedures up to date and serves as the nominating committee. The chair of the committee serves on the Board. Connie and Dorothy are rotating off the committee this year leaving opportunities to others to learn about all aspects of branch activities.

December is a month for giving. Non-profit organizations, including AAUW send many solicitations for the end of year funds. This year branch members have two good options to donate to AAUW and the funds will be targeted to our local branch mission projects. Donation to Tech Trek, a STEM camp for 7th grade girls, or NCCWSL, a national conference for college women, will benefit individuals from our community. This has been true for funds given to Tech Trek; however, the local targeting of donations for the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) is new this year. If you read last month's newsletter, the Tacoma Branch and AAUW joined in a partnership and formed the Virginia Cummings NCCWSL fund. This fund will provide scholarship funds for the registration fees, including room and board for the conference held annually at the University of Maryland.

Members who want to donate to this special fund online can now go to the AAUW website, click on DONATE, then LEADERSHIP; on that drop-down menu, click on CLICK HERE TO GIVE to another program or cause. The drop down will list Virginia Cummings NCCWSL fund. Donations in any amount will be appreciated and will benefit the mission projects of the Tacoma Branch and our community.

Here are the guidelines for your proposal:
\*Any member or group of members may propose uses for the funds to the Board for recommendation to the membership. Any proposed project must show how the project advances the branch mission and must designate a committee, task force or individual to implement the project.

\*\*Leaders of each project will report the results to the membership before the end of the fiscal year in which the money was allocated.


