Human trafficking thrives in Pierce County, but it is hidden from public for many reasons. Come to this program and find out where and how this abuse is happening and why. We will explore the primary form of human trafficking in our area—the commercial sexual exploitation of children.

Janet Runbeck has the experience and knowledge to be our guide into this important topic. A registered nurse, she has volunteered in many public health venues since 2007. She is the winner of the 2009 UW Tacoma Distinguished Alumni Award, the 2014 City of Destiny Award, and the Soroptimist International of Tacoma Women Helping Women Award in 2014. Presently, she is a member of the leadership team of the Pierce County Coalition Against Trafficking and an advisor to Washington Engage, an anti-trafficking organization using legislative advocacy, professional engagement and community grassroots partnerships to advance human rights.

President's Corner

Her name is Virginia Cummings. Some of you may remember her. Unfortunately I never

got to meet her. I only got to know about her at the memorial tea held in her honor, from her family and AAUW friends. As I understand it, she traveled a great deal with her husband, who was in the military. Wherever she landed she joined the local AAUW chapter. The organization was that important to her. As a girl, she was lucky enough to have had a benefactor that saw her intelligence and offered her the opportunity to go to college, a privilege she wouldn't have had without help. The impact of this kindness, a chance that so many young women never got, spurred her on to support and aid others like her.

In Virginia, AAUW Tacoma found a true friend, a confidant, a leader and a philanthropist. She was involved in book groups, the board and was benevolent overseer of 'The Lunch Bunch'. She made everyone feel welcome and important, heard and embraced. Our branch didn't just note her passing. It genuinely felt it. She was honored at the memorial tea with many laughs, perhaps with a few tears. I know of at least one visitor that day who came for tea and to see what AAUW was all about, and joined because she was so impressed with tales about Virginia Cummings and the heartfelt reverence and honor she received. Who wouldn't want to be a part of an organization comprised of such dynamic women?

Her family was kind enough to give our branch an honorarium in her name; a one-time donation to be used to benefit a branch mission of our choosing. Connie Dunkelberger felt that this honorarium could be a seed for something bigger. She has created the Virginia Cummings NCCWSL Fund, which last year

helped seven young women in our area attend the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) in Washington, DC. As a national fund, it has collected donations from as far away as Florida but has, so far, been sustained primarily by local donations. It is Connie's hope that the fund will continue to honor Virginia Cummings by benefitting college women and, in turn, generating appreciative benefactors far into the future.



Online Renewal Directions

1. Enter aauw.org in your search engine – you will be taken to the home page

- 2. Look at the gray bar across the top of the page. The tab 'AAUW' will be highlighted in white. Move your cursor to the 7th tab 'Login' and click. A new page will open.
- 3. The login page has 2 white boxes. The top one is for your member number (your number is by your entry in the handbook). If you have not set up a password, do it now.
 - ➤ Go down to the line 'First time logging in? You will need to register.'

 Click on 'need to register. You'll be taken to a new page. The instructions are simple and you will be able to get a password registered in minutes.
 - Once you get your password start over at step 1. You might want to write your password in your handbook.
 - > Type in your password. You will be taken back to the home page, but the gray bar at the top now has your name instead of 'Login' in the 7th tab.
- 4. On the right of the gray bar is a search box. Type in 'msd' (leave out the quotes), click on the search icon. On the new page, the first selection under the search box is 'Member Services Database'. Click on it.
- 5. The next page has a green box 'enter the msd'. Click on it. You will get a white page titled 'Access Member Services Database.' Click on the gray bar 'Enter Member Services Database'. It will turn blue, and then take you to your personal information in the database.
- 6. Click on 'renew my membership' toward the bottom of the list on the left hand side of the page. Fill out the form. Submit it.
- 7. You're done. 10 minutes. Now wasn't that easy?
