Motions Passed at the AAUW Business Meeting, March 19, 2016

Election of Officers

Officers nominated: Membership Vice President - Carol Rikerd; Governance and Development Committee - Stella Jones; Secretary - Dolora Neumaier (with support from Connie Dunkelberger).

A motion was made to accept the slate of nominees for Membership, Governance and Secretary. The motion was seconded. The Chair called for further discussion and there was none. The Chair then called for a vote. The motion was approved by raised hands with no nays.

<u>2016 – 2017 Budget</u>

A motion was made moved and seconded to approve the 2016-2017 Budget as presented by the Treasurer. Discussion:

The proposal for the 2016-17 budget was sent to all members in the March newsletter. No comments were received by the Treasurer. The Board retains the ability to make changes in allocated funds as needed during the fiscal year to meet administrative and mission obligations. No changes were proposed.

The Chair called for a vote. The proposed budget was approved unanimously by a show of hands.

Increase Branch Dues

A motion was made to increase the Tacoma Branch dues by \$2 for fiscal year 2016-17. The motion was seconded. There was no further discussion. The Chair called for a vote. The motion was approved by voice vote with no nays.

The dues increase is effective as soon as the Treasurer notifies National AAUW and the increase is reflected in our Branch information.

Mission Proposals for 2017-2018

A motion was made to fund Tech Trek with \$2700, NCCWSL with \$2000 and Elect Her with \$800, for a total of \$5,500 for 2017 mission projects. The motion was seconded. The Chair called for further discussion; there was none. The Chair offered the three proposals as a slate for voting. The motion to fund all three proposals passed by raised hands with no nays.

State Convention Delegates

Nominated: C. Dunkelberger, M. Letterman, D. McBride

A motion was made to approve the above nominees to attend the state convention. The motion was seconded. The Chair called for other nominations; none were offered. The Chair called for a vote. The motion passed unanimously.

Program Proposal

Member J. Anderson (Pierce County Auditor) wrote the Branch that she would like to arrange an exclusive training for AAUW members about transgender awareness and public policy issues.

A motion was made to respond to Auditor Anderson, asking more information about her timeframe, and presentation details about transgender issues. The motion was seconded. The Chair called for further discussion, none was offered. The motion was approved with no nays.
