Expanding Our Reach Through Mission Grants

Do you have an idea about ways to break barriers to equality for women and girls in Pierce County? For instance: a special research project, a mentoring program, an arts competition, assistance for victims of sexual assault, a STEM project, a scholarship for a lone mother seeking economic self-sufficiency? Perhaps you would like us to support a research project to find out more about the status of women and girls in our area. Or do you know about a great program that helps women prepare for college and think the branch could help?

The membership will choose the projects that the branch will fund in 2018-2019 at the annual meeting in March. If you have a good idea for how we can best use our mission budget (around \$5,000 each year) to promote our goals, submit it to branch president, Susan Hesselgrave, by February 1, 2018.

Here are the guidelines for your mission proposal:


Proposal: Any member or group of members may propose uses for the funds to the Board for recommendation to the membership. Any proposed project must show how the project advances the branch mission and must designate a committee, task force or individual to monitor the project.

Deliverable: Leaders of each project will report the results to the membership before the end of the fiscal year in which the money was allocated.

On November 28th, AAUW turns 136 years old!

From our website: "On November 28, 1881, Marion Talbot, then a recent graduate from Boston University, and Ellen Swallow Richards, the first woman graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, invited 15 alumnae from eight colleges to a meeting in Boston. Discouraged by the lack of opportunities available to them, the women discussed how they would join together to help other women attend college and to assist those who had already graduated."

Here's a <u>link</u> to the AAUW website about AAUW's 131st birthday in 2012, which includes an audio clip of Marian Talbot (age 86) talking about that first meeting.

The meeting was arranged with the help of Ellen Swallow Richards, who was a generation older than Marion. Ellen was the first woman in the U.S. to earn a degree in chemistry (1868). She worked on water quality and water pollution in her early career, and pioneered Home Economics as an academic field later in life. You can read about Ellen here.

Tacoma Branch has had three months of interesting and informative meetings: September at PBS station KBTC, October hearing from our Tech Trek participants, and November talking with state Representatives Laurie Jinkins and Christine Kilduff. The very few of us, from seven to 16 members, who attended these meetings learned about and connected with our community in enjoyable companionship. Wouldn't you like to join us? 


