Sustaining Tech Trek for 2019

AAUW-WA began operating Tech Trek with one camp serving 50 girls in 2013. During 2018, we conducted three camps serving more than 150 campers.

The Tacoma branch has applied itself, successfully sponsoring over 10% of total Trekkers. But to sustain this momentum, Tacoma requires volunteers. Both committee and leadership (Chair) slots are available.



Committee work is conducted from January through April. We contact schools, seek applicants, and schedule interviews. This can be done from the comfort of your home or office if our weather or your mobility are a deterrence.

The short applications are simple to review. But conducting interviews takes time, transportation and energy to vet the applicants (and alternates) who will be invited to camp. Per AAUW guidelines, each applicant interview must be conducted by two AAUW members.

Of necessity interviews are conducted at the school during, or just after school hours. Working around spring break schedules, interview volunteers are needed from around mid-February through late March 2019. But you don't need to

belong to the Tech Trek Committee to interview. You simply have to be an AAUW member who can be available to work with the Tech Trek Committee for even one local interview session. If the school has several candidates, then you can be in several interviews during one school visit.

But there's more. You also get to attend a Tacoma Branch Tech Trek "Meet & Greet" during June 2019. Campers, parents and Tech Trek Groupies (siblings) are brought together for an informal ice breaker and sharing of expectations. 


